The Irish team had the smallest squad of the tournament, with only seven players available, but Bohemian Foundation President, Thomas Hynes, says what they lacked in numbers, they made up for in talent and confidence.

"They're Northside lads mostly from Ballymun who play together in the Leinster League," he told Northside People. "A lot of them would have grown up together and gone to the same schools.

"They play as the Bohemian Foundation team in all the tournaments and exhibition games we're involved in. "I was worried about how
