Retired from HM Prison Service in 1987 after 32 years of working in prisons, governing HMPs Hull, Long Lartin and Winson Green.



A renowned practitioner. Bill

contributed much to the development of hostels, working out schemes and regimes for long term prisoners.

In 1986 he attended the first Lectures, named after him. He continued to support them right up until 1997. Sadly Bill died on 15th November 1997. He was considered one of the preeminent Governors of his era.

Throughout his career he was ever aware of the essential humanity of his staff and charges.

His inspiration and support are greatly missed.
